Transparent Truth

In January 2011, Collective Encounters' youth theatre decided to explore why in some parts of Merseyside 9 out of 10 children are classed as living in poverty, and how these figures translate to the national and global experiences. This led to a discussion on world poverty and an exploration of the international trafficking of children. The result of their explorations is Transparent Truth, an interactive and hard-hitting theatre piece performed by this group of remarkable young actors.

- estimated 1.2 million children are trafficked worldwide each year.
- 161 countries are reported to be involved in human trafficking, either as a source, transit or destination country.
- 95% of victims experienced physical or sexual violence (based on data from selected European countries).
- 43% of victims are used for forced commercial sexual exploitation, of whom 98% are women and girls.
- 32% of victims are used for forced economic exploitation, of whom 56% are women.
