- 1. Lobby your Councillors and MP's. By writing, emailing and giving presentations, members of the public can influence the way members of parliament vote in the House of Commons. Visit www.parliament.uk/get-involved/have-your-say/lobbying/
- 2. Contact Liverpool Young Persons Advisory Service. LYPAS offers a range of services to support young people with diverse issues. Visit www.ypas.org.uk
- 3. Boycott big business and begin to support local and independent businesses in Merseyside.
- 4. Support and advocate childrens rights. Organisations such as Save the Children specifically support the rights of children locally, nationally and internationally.
- 5. Contact your Citizens Advice Bureau. They offer support on a range of issues including debt, housing, benefit entitlements, consumer, and employment issues.
